Basic Drawing Tools: (For beginning drawing students)

*[Anything with an * in front of it is optional]*

- Graphite drawing pencils --- #2 or HB (hard), #2B (medium), #4B (soft), #6B (extra soft)
[For those more serious about brand names: Derwent, Faber-Castell 9000, Staedtler Mars Lumograph are excellent brands]
- Charcoal drawing pencils --- HB (hard), #2B (medium), #4B (soft), #6B (extra soft)
[Ritmo, Royal, or General are good brands.]
- Kneaded eraser
- Art vinyl or plastic eraser
- *Small pencil sharpener
- Blending stump or tortillion
- *Sketch pad (less expensive paper for exercises & experimentation) 14 x 17 or 16 x 20 are good sizes
- Drawing tablet (White, heavier weight: 60 – 80#) – 14 X 17 or 16 x 20 good sizes

Additional Intermediate Materials: (For more advanced drawing students)

- Vine or compressed charcoal sticks
- *Charcoal or graphite powder
- Colored pencils
- Conte crayons or pencils - (White, Sanquine brown, Venetian Red, Sepia)
- Tinted paper such as Mi-teintes or pastel paper
- *Charcoal paper
- *White Bristol Board (fairly expensive) or illustration board
- *Drawing backboard for more stability [In-class backboards are provided]
- Colored pencils, at least 24 count
